The Process of Preservation: *Behind the scenes in preserving Reynolda's iconic Ludowici roof*

Join us for a webinar about the process of preserving and restoring Reynolda House Museum of American Art's iconic green Ludowici roof. Faced with the many challenges of preserving the integrity and originality of a historic staple in Winston-Salem, Reynolda House, Ludowici, and Baker Roofing have teamed up over 100 years later to recreate the original Ludowici roof through replication of color and design aesthetic.

We are pleased to host this behind the scenes discussion via YouTube Live in conjunction with **Preservation Forsyth**, **Baker Roofing**, and **Reynolda House** in commemorating the roof replacement later this year.

The Reynolda House was built in 1917 by Katharine Smith Reynolds and her husband R. J. Reynolds, founder of the R. J. Reynolds Tobacco Company, and architect Charles Barton Keen. The home became the center of a 1,000+ acre estate and a cornerstone in the area's history. In 1965 it opened to the public as an institution dedicated to the arts and education, and as an art museum in 1967. The house holds one of the country's finest collections of American paintings and is located in Winston-Salem, North Carolina.
